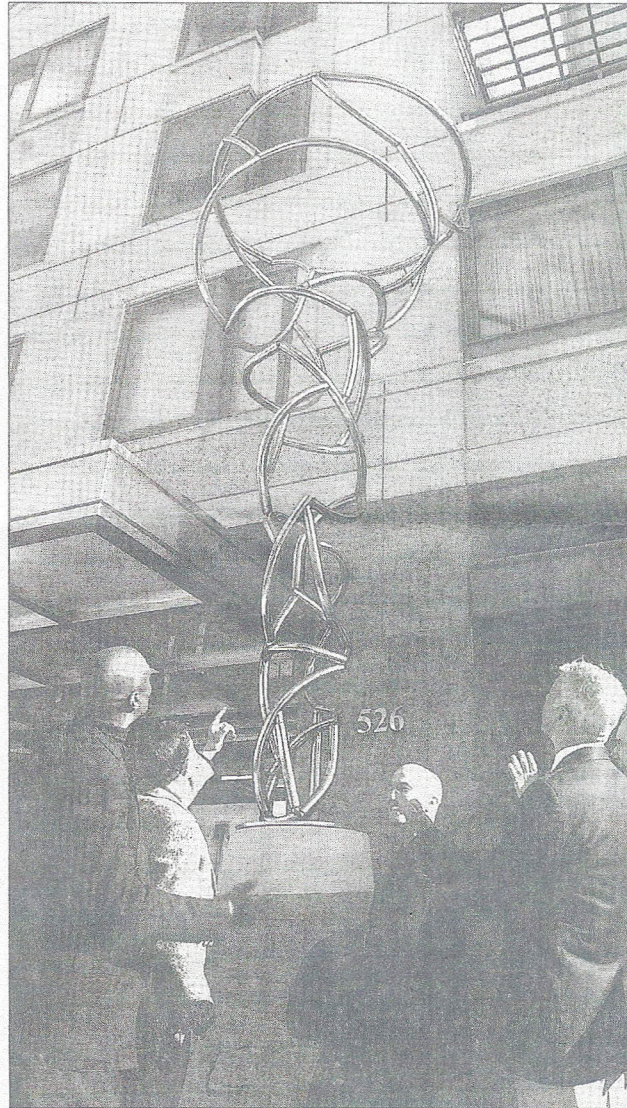


A.C. SCULPTURES UNVEILED

The Bella condominium complex in Atlantic City unveiled sculptures that now flank the building's front door in a Friday ceremony. The two sculptures at the building at Pacific and New Jersey avenues were designed by artist Patrick Strzelec out of stainless steel and are exactly the same weight and height. He chose the material because of its shimmering quality that emulates the nearby water, he said in a release. They were 'inspired respectively by the natural and the built environments that define the shore's energy,' he added.
